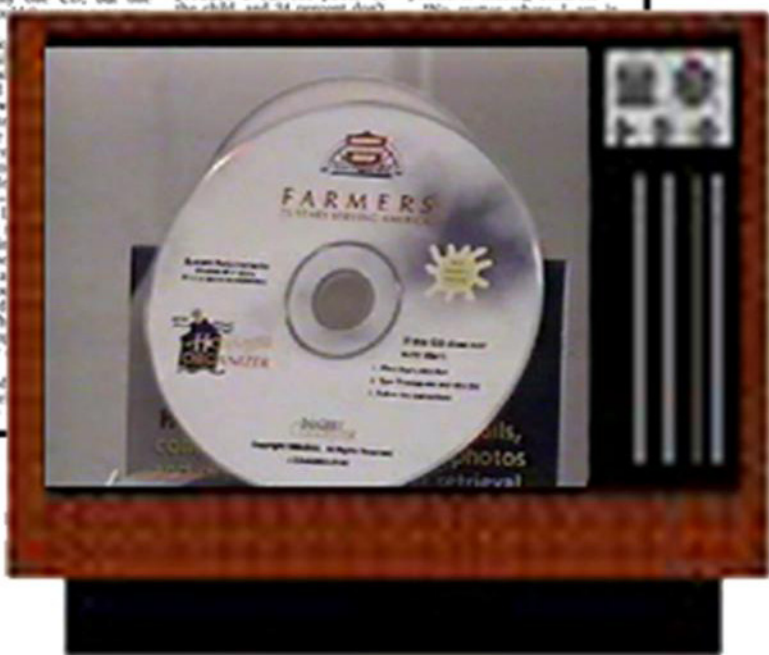
quest of the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children.
